



Dear North Kensington Community,

As we fast approach the 2nd year anniversary we wanted share with you the plans that Grenfell United are involved in.

At the request of the bereaved and survivors we will be holding a private gathering for all the bereaved and survivors to be together in remembrance of those we lost. This will be held during the afternoon.

At 6.15pm, we have also arranged with the site team for bereaved and survivors to go closer to the Tower than the current boundary if they wish to lay wreaths and flowers. Due to size and security restrictions we will also be inviting 2 representatives from Resident Associations and Community Groups to join this part of the day, and we will be contacting those groups separately.

At 7pm, in conjunction with faith leaders from across the community, there will be a multi faith vigil for the whole community on Silchester Road, similar to the midday event held last year.

This will be followed by the Silent Walk at 7.45pm and speeches at the end. This will be the normal route from Methodist Church, up Lancaster Road, along Ladbroke Grove, down Cambridge Gardens (possibly Oxford Gardens or Basset Road dependent on numbers in attendance) back along Bramley Road, left onto Silchester Road before returning to Methodist Church.

Please follow Grenfell Silent Walk or Grenfell United for further updates.

The Tower along with other towers around the community will be lit up in green in the evening.

We are planning to have screens set up along Silchester Road & Kingsdown Road to allow the community to be a part of all the events from 6pm.

We hope you can join us in remembering the 72 lives we lost and in solidarity and unity for those affected.
